PERTH, 7th November.

The remains of Peter Headland and his companions have been found on an island to the eastward of Roebuck Bay. There are evidences to show that after the brutal murder of these men the natives sank the schooner and escaped to the mainland in the dingy. Headland was associated with the earliest settlement in the North and with the pearshelling industry.
