

## Death of Mr William Giblett.

Mr. William Giblett, a well-known resident of the district, aged 65 years, died on Wednesday evening. At about 5.30 he sat down to tea with his two daughters at their residence in Burgoyne Street. He was in good health. They had corned beef on the table, and directly deceased took a mouthful he commenced to choke. His daughters tried to relieve him but without avail. Dr. Frost was sent for but was too late to save his life, as he expired almost immediately after the doctor's arrival. Mr. J. T. Reilly, acting Coroner, to whom the circumstances were reported, deemed an inquest was unnecessary. The deceased leaves a grown-up family of 11 children.

The funeral took place on Friday morning and was very largely attended, there being representatives from all parts of the district present. The cortege left the deceased's late residence in Burgoyne Street and proceeded to St. Joseph's Church and thence to the R.C. portion of the Northam cemetery. The burial service was conducted by the Rev. Fr. Fabey. The pall-bearers were Messrs. H. Forward, S. Martin, R. Minson, J. Wyatt, H. Blake and J. Forward. The chief mourners were the children, brother, and sons-in-law of the deceased. The wreaths were numerous. The funeral arrangements were carried out by Mr. J. W. Purslowe of Fitzgerald Street.
